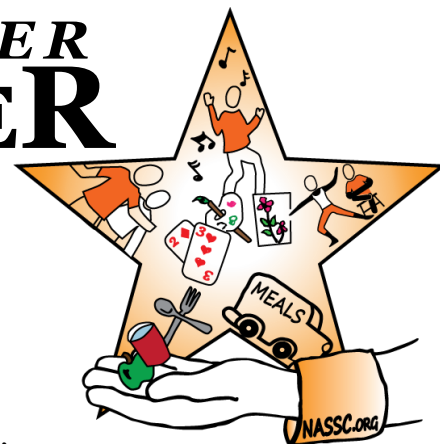
ON YOUR HONOR

LIHEAP

The Pennsylvania LIHEAP program offers heating assistance for income-eligible households. For the 2024-2025 season, households of 1 qualify with annual incomes up to \$22,590, and 2-person households qualify up to \$30,660.

Emergency crisis grants are also available for heating system breakdowns, fuel shortages, or shutoff threats. Assistance is provided promptly, often within 10 days. Applications are open from November 4, 2024, to April 4, 2025. Applications are available here at the Northeastern Senior Center, or you can apply online or stop in at the county assistance office and they will help you fill out the application.

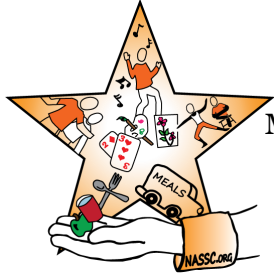

FYI: The daily lunch meal is paid by the York County Area Agency on Aging and the cost is \$3.75 (*under 60 guests pay full price*) and by donation for members. **Please note** that our funding continues to be based on the number of meals **you** order and eat. To keep our doors open, we must average 40 meals a day (53 to meet past funding), so it is very important that you help us! It's easy enough, just call before **10am one business day ahead** to order and if you can't make it, call ASAP, so we can find another member to eat that meal.
